IB CREDIT:

Student with an International Baccalaureate Diploma

- Approximately nine (9) 3-hour courses (twenty-eight (28) semester hours) will be given for the completion of an International Baccalaureate Diploma.
- Laboratory courses and/or foreign language courses may result in a total of more than 28 semester hours.
- Credits will be distributed based on exam subjects, the level of the exam (HL, SL), and the grade received (1-7), for a total to sum to approximately 28 semester hours.
- Lower scores (e.g., 3 5) are considered for specific course credit on a one-on-one basis, based on discussions with the student and Brevard College placement tests.
- Similarly, SL courses are considered on a one-on-one basis, based on discussions with the student.
- If it is determined that a specific course substitution is not appropriate, based on scores, elective credits will be given, such that total of awarded credits is between 24-28 for the diploma student.
- Brevard College placement tests in foreign language are recommended to determine credit for courses past the elementary level in a language, 101 and 102.

Students without an International Baccalaureate Diploma, but participated in the program

 Students with IB credits, but no diploma, will be awarded credits for individual subject areas for which they achieved 5+ scores, and for which Brevard College placement tests indicate success in that subject.
