

## Assistant Professor of Criminal Justice

Successful candidates will have experience in law enforcement and a master's degree in Criminology, Criminal Justice, Sociology, or a related discipline. We seek an effective teacher who will contribute to a strong and growing Criminal Justice Program that emphasizes experiential learning and application.

Successful candidates must be interested in teaching courses at all levels of the undergraduate curriculum, including introductory courses, service courses, and upper-level courses. Teaching responsibilities include Introduction to Criminal Justice, Introduction to Crime Scene Investigation, and other courses in criminal justice. The successful candidate will advise students, serve on campus committees, and contribute to the life of Brevard College.
