Assistant Professor of Theatre – Acting-Directing/History

Brevard College seeks an experienced educator for a tenure-track position in our dynamic and growing Theatre program, beginning fall 2020. Teaching responsibilities will include the History of Theatre, Movement, Acting courses according to specialty, and courses in the General Education Curriculum. The successful candidate will direct twice annually and work collaboratively with other faculty on activities like recruiting, mentoring, advising, publicity and campus committee work. Capacity to grow and to take on leadership roles in the program, division, and across campus is expected.

Qualifications:

- MFA or PhD in Theatre/Drama, Acting, or Directing;
- Experience teaching and directing at the college level;
- Excellent collaborative, time management and communication skills;
- Desire to work in a college setting that strongly emphasizes professionalism, experiential learning and collaboration; and
- Professional theatrical experience is desirable. Experience with armed stage combat, puppetry and/or design are also of interest.
