Dear Friends,

Greetings from Brevard College! Last year, I committed to you that we would grow enrollment, invest in the campus infrastructure, and focus on student success. This year, I am excited to report that we have made extraordinary progress in all of these areas.

The academic year opened with 751 students, the largest enrollment since we transitioned to a four-year college over twenty years ago. We welcomed more than 300 new students for the third consecutive year. The academic profile of entering students has increased significantly. We are at full capacity in our residence halls with plans to build another one within the next two years.

Through the generosity of donors and foundations, we have grown the endowment, renovated and updated campus facilities, and strengthened our academic programs. Specifically, we have initiated an on-line summer school program, expanded the Education program to include Early Childhood Education certification, and have hired 18 new faculty members over the past two years. During this same period, we have invested over \$3,000,000 in campus facilities in a wide range of projects.

The college is in the last year of the transition to NCAA-Division III (non-scholarship athletics), meaning that we will have full membership status in the fall of 2020, allowing all of our teams to compete for post-season championships. The student athlete experience has been significantly enhanced through upgraded facilities, off-season breaks and professional transportation to away games. Our teams are now competitive in every sport.

Brevard College has a proud history of providing educational opportunities for deserving and qualified students. We do this best because of our size and our educational model. We plan to add another 100 students to reach our goal of 854 within the next two to three years. This is our "magic number" to manage our growth and enhance the student experience. It will ensure the ideal academic environment, the optimum residential life experience, and financial stability for the college.

One of the new ILO programs is called Eyes on the Skies, taught by Dr. Michael Castelaz, Professor of Physics. In this course, he will use observational and computational astrophysics methods to help students understand the structure and evolution of stars, nebulae, and exotic galactic objects like black holes. During spring break, students will study at the Pisgah Astronomical Research Institute (PARI), learning to use optical and radio telescopes to research exoplanets and the dynamics of the Milky Way Galaxy.

The plan brings to life Brevard College's bold commitment to student success by incorporating our beautiful location, the value of place in experiential learning, and the need to invest in our infrastructure to deliver our unique brand of teaching.
