

Faculty and Humanities Division Chair

Brevard College seeks an enthusiastic teacher and administrator at the Associate Professor or Professor level to lead the Humanities Division of the College, which includes programs in English, History, Integrated Studies, and Philosophy and Religion.

This tenure track position requires a terminal degree in a Humanities field and evidence of administrative experience or potential for academic leadership. As the Division is undergoing strategic planning to envision the nature of humanities curriculum at the College going forward, experience in developing innovative humanities curriculum of all kinds, including curriculum that integrates digital communications, would be a plus.

Division Chair responsibilities include leading the Humanities faculty in the development and implementation of a new strategic plan, oversight, supervision, and evaluation of all Humanities faculty, including adjunct faculty, and class scheduling for the division. The Humanities Division Chair is a member of the Academic Leadership Team (ALT), the College's chief academic administrative body, chaired by the Vice President for Academic Affairs and Dean of the Faculty. Division Chairs normally receive release time equivalent to half of a normal annual 24 credit hour teaching load and a summer stipend for administrative duties.

Brevard College seeks to recruit and retain a diverse workforce and encourages qualified candidates across all group demographics to apply.

Brevard College, founded in 1853, is a residential liberal arts college. Situated in the heart of the Blue Ridge Mountains, Brevard College is located 33 miles southwest of Asheville, North Carolina.
