Brevard College is always changing. Brevard College never changes.

BC has evolved over the years from a two-year institution established in 1934 with 394 students and 24 faculty to a four-year college that enrolled nearly 800 students this year and plans to implement graduate programs in the fall. While the college changes to keep up with the needs of new students, its strengths have remained the same over the years. BC prides itself on being an educational institution where students know each other and faculty members know the students.



Experiential education is what Brevard College now excels in and offers students. Yes, there may be a lecture or two. But most faculty and most students work to find ways to *experience education*. For over 20 years, the Voice of the Rivers, a trip for students and faculty, has been a favorite experience. History students work together to make the past come alive as they portray the times they are studying. Teams of students work together on research projects.

While Brevard College students probably never heard the word experiential in earlier years, much of their learning was based on experiences. Fine arts programs are, by definition, experiential. When secretarial students studied typing or shorthand, that was experiential. Labs in biology and chemistry gave students experience in those disciplines. The Clarion, the college newspaper, and the Pertelote, the college yearbook, were experiences for the students who worked on them. Brevard, a small liberal arts college when it opened, remains a small liberal arts college.

Just as the mountains of the Blue Ridge surrounding and enfolding Brevard College remain changeless and ever-changing, so does the college itself. It welcomes new students, faculty, and staff every year – an automatic source of change. It continually holds true to its values and its core beliefs – a source of enduring stability.

Athletics are a foundation of the Brevard College experience going back to the days of Weaver College and Rutherford College.



The Men's Soccer Team, under Coach Helio "L" D'Anna, winning the USA South Conference West Division Championship.



Baseball enjoyed its winningest season since 2012. Under Head Coach Michael Victory, the team went 7-6 in conference play and qualified for the USA South Conference postseason berth.



The Women's Soccer team finished 6-2-1, earning a USA South Conference West Division Semifinals trip. The lady Tornados ended their regular season on a six-match unbeaten streak.



Football continued their success, claiming a spot as co-champions of the USA South West Division. The Tornados are now 14-3 overall since November of 2019 under Coach Bill Khayat.

For over 100 years, Tornados have competed on the field and achieved in the classroom in an effort to become well-rounded individuals ready to serve the world around them. In the midst of a challenging year, student-athletes broke records that deserve celebrating.

Student-athletes from the school's 19 sports combined for a record-setting cumulative grade point average of 3.16 in the Fall 2020 Semester. The 3.16 combined GPA is the highest for the Brevard College Department of Athletics since joining the NCAA in 2006-07.


212 student-athletes (over 50% of BC's student-athletes) were named to either the Dean's List or the Honor Roll with 24 Tornados earning perfect 4.0 semesters during the Fall of 2020.

A total of 48 student-athletes graduated in May 2021 with 35 of those seniors earning a cumulative GPA of 3.0 or higher and receiving Scholar-Athlete stoles.

Congratulations to the athletics staff on a job well done! With moving all competition into the spring semester, the college's athletics staff executed 133 intercollegiate contests, including 67 home events, across 16 varsity sports in a few short months.
