**Assistant Professor of Criminal Justice**

Brevard College seeks an enthusiastic teacher to fill a tenure-track, nine-month faculty position as an Assistant Professor of Criminal Justice, beginning in the fall of 2023. Candidates considered for this position should possess a terminal degree in a relevant field (e.g., Ph.D. in Criminal Justice or Ph.D. in Sociology with specialization in CJ, in hand by starting date). Master's degrees in Criminal Justice will be considered.

We seek an innovative and collaborative teacher who will participate fully in a thriving Criminal Justice Program that emphasizes experiential learning and application. Faculty in the program participate in curriculum development, maintaining community relationships, advising students, program assessment, and all other aspects of the program. The successful candidate will demonstrate a record of, or potential for, excellence in teaching and a strong commitment to working within a diverse liberal arts environment.

Candidates must be interested in teaching courses at all levels of the undergraduate curriculum, including introductory courses, service courses, and upper-level courses. Teaching responsibilities include Introduction to Criminal Justice, Restorative Justice, Ethics, and other lower and upper-level courses in the major. The candidate should have knowledge of social inequalities as they relate to Criminal Justice. Experience in an applied area of Criminal Justice is a plus.

Brevard College, founded in 1853, is a residential liberal arts college. Situated in the heart of the Blue Ridge Mountains, Brevard College is located 33 miles southwest of Asheville, North Carolina.
