Brevard College seeks an innovative and enthusiastic teacher to lead a thriving Business and Organizational Leadership Program. This nine-month, tenure-track position will be at the Assistant or Associate Professor level, depending on qualifications. Candidates considered for this position will possess a terminal degree in a relevant field (e.g., DBA or a PhD in a business discipline; in hand by starting date). The successful candidate will demonstrate excellence in undergraduate teaching and have experiential teaching skills. Administrative experience with program assessment and curriculum development is desired.

We seek a collaborative leader who will work with current faculty to develop areas of specialization within the program. Because the program is thriving and growing, the program coordinator must be an innovative, dynamic, and collaborative leader with an informed vision that will shape the future of the program. Candidate area of specialization is open, and teaching responsibilities will include Introduction to Business, Business Ethics, and the Senior Capstone seminar, as well as lower and upper-level courses in the candidate's area of expertise. The standard teaching load is 12 credit hours/semester, and all faculty members actively contribute to program assessment, serve on committees, advise students, and participate in professional development and service to the College.

Brevard College, founded in 1853, is a residential liberal arts college. Situated in the heart of the Blue Ridge Mountains, Brevard College is located 33 miles southwest of Asheville, North Carolina. Brevard College is committed to an experiential liberal arts education that encourages personal growth and inspires artistic, intellectual, and social action. Our faculty purposefully engage with learners in direct experience and focused reflections in order to increase knowledge, develop skills, and clarify values.

The starting date for this position is August 2023. Review of applications will begin immediately and will continue until the position is filled. In order to provide a safe and productive learning and living environment, Brevard College conducts background investigations on all final candidates being considered for employment.

Applicants should email (1) a letter of application describing the applicant's qualifications relevant to teaching at Brevard College; (2) a statement of teaching philosophy; (3) a curriculum vitae documenting relevant experience, as well as courses the applicant has taught and is prepared to teach; (4) a sample syllabus from a recent course; and (5) names and contact information for three professional references, at least one of whom must be the applicant's current or most recent supervisor.
