

Brevard College Fall 2024 Assistant Professor of History

The Brevard College History Program seeks a tenure-track Assistant Professor of American History, beginning in the fall of 2024. Candidates should have a Ph.D. in American History. Specialization within the scholarly field is open, but the committee especially welcomes applicants with an interest in contributing to the pre-law minor or History education licensure program.

Successful candidates must be engaging teachers of History at all levels and fields of our undergraduate History curriculum, ranging from first- and second-year general education courses in American History to upper-level courses for the History program. Teaching responsibilities include, but are not limited to: both American History surveys; upper-division thematic courses, such as U.S. Constitutional History or Wilderness in American Life; senior project classes, wherein students complete a capstone senior thesis. The successful candidate will demonstrate a record of excellence in teaching and use of experiential learning pedagogies. The standard teaching load is 12 credit hours/semester, and all faculty members actively contribute to program assessment, serve on committees, advise students, and participate in professional development and service to the College.

Brevard College, founded in 1853, is a residential liberal arts college. Situated in the heart of the Blue Ridge Mountains, Brevard College is located 33 miles southwest of Asheville, North Carolina. Brevard College is committed to an experiential liberal arts education that encourages personal growth and inspires artistic, intellectual, and social action. Our faculty purposefully engage with learners in direct experience and focused reflections in order to increase knowledge, develop skills, and clarify values. We are ranked #2 by US News and World Report in both Undergraduate Teaching and Most Innovative Schools.

The starting date for this position is August 2024. Review of applications will begin on November 1, 2023, and will continue until the position is filled. Brevard College seeks to recruit and retain a diverse workforce, and encourages qualified candidates across all group demographics to apply.

Applicants should submit (1) a letter of application describing the applicant's qualifications relevant to teaching at Brevard College; (2) a statement of teaching philosophy; (3) a curriculum vitae documenting relevant experience, as well as courses the applicant has taught and is prepared to teach; (4) a sample syllabus from a recent course; and (5) names and contact information for three professional references, at least one of whom should be the applicant's current or most recent supervisor.
