

Brevard College Fall 2024 Assistant Professor of Psychology

Brevard College seeks an enthusiastic teacher to join a thriving Psychology Program in a tenure-track position as an Assistant Professor of Psychology, beginning in the fall of 2024.

We seek a dedicated teacher who will participate fully in a Psychology Program that emphasizes experiential learning and application. Faculty in the program participate in curriculum development, advising students, program assessment, and all other aspects of the program. The successful candidate will demonstrate a record of, or potential for, excellence in teaching, and a strong commitment to working within a diverse liberal arts environment.

Candidates considered for this position will specialize in clinical or counseling psychology, and possess a terminal degree in a relevant field (PhD in psychology or counseling, or a PsyD). Candidates with a masters degree and at least 18 graduate hours in clinical or counseling psychology or social work will be considered for a non-tenure-track appointment. Candidates must be interested in teaching courses at all levels of the undergraduate curriculum, including introductory courses, service courses, and upper-level courses. Teaching responsibilities include introductory psychology, Abnormal Psychology, courses in clinical and counseling psychology, and other lower and upper-level courses in the major. The successful candidate will also supervise undergraduate practicum students.

Brevard College, founded in 1853, is a residential liberal arts college. Situated in the heart of the Blue Ridge Mountains, Brevard College is located 33 miles southwest of Asheville, North Carolina.
