Renovated Student Success Center Supports First-Year Advising Program

The Brevard College First-Year Advisors work individually with students to help them transition to college, plan their academic and career goals, make connections with key stakeholders on campus, and understand how to access campus resources and services. First-Year Advisors use Appreciative Advising developed by Dr. Jennifer Bloom. Each phase of Appreciative Advising supports improved connection with students, understanding their perspectives and challenges, and assisting the student in planning and executing actions to reach desired goals.

Students are asked to meet with their first-year advisor five times during the fall semester as part of their First-Year Experience class (FYE 101). Students will continue to meet with their advisor during the spring semester as part of their FYE 104 requirements. The advisor's job is to work with students to identify opportunities, help them make connections, navigate campus systems, and offer support where it is needed most.

This summer, renovations began inside Coltrane Hall to create the new home for our First-Year Advising Program. The renovations are on going at the time of print for this publication. The project is expected to be completed by the first week of September.

This past summer, Professor Uyizeye attended the Freshwater Science Conference in Brisbane, Australia. During the conference, he delivered two presentations on his preliminary results on PFAS, forever chemicals in the North East, US as well as potential ways to advance sound monitoring of freshwater ecosystems while promoting community engagement in Africa.

Professor Andrea Boccanfuso serves as the Coordinator of the Theatre program here at Brevard College. Prior to coming to Brevard, she spent several years as head of design at one of the country's largest fashion event lighting companies, IMCD Lighting Inc., whose clients include Prada, Lady Gaga, Google, Chanel, Versace, and Calvin Klein. Prior to that, she was a project coordinator at The Lighting Design Group, Inc., where she served as lighting venues coordinator for NBC's coverage of the 2006 Winter Olympic Games in Torino, Italy. With LDG, Boccanfuso also coordinated lighting projects for ABC, CNN, Oxygen, The Food Network, and NBC (2004 Democracy Plaza at Rockefeller Plaza).

For over 25 years, Professor Boccanfuso has worked at the Brevard Music Center, one of the country's premier summer training programs for orchestra studies, piano, and opera as the Director of Production. Her experiences are shared within her classroom and under the lights on stage at Brevard College.

Brevard College Football Coaching Staff

The same experiential principles from the classroom are applied on the field for the Brevard College Football staff. The coaching team consists of professional football coaches, professional players, and alumni from the BC Football Program. Four of the coaches, Bill Khayat, Martin Bayless, Everett Lindsay, and Chris Syminton, have NFL and other professional playing or coaching experience. The network of these coaches have attracted professional players who are looking to share their experiences to develop players while growing their own coaching profile. LaDarius Wiley and Garrett Groshek return to the sidelines at BC after successful seasons in the United States Football League. Coach Khayat has set a strong foundation for the program which now is seeing BC alumni return to coach and give back to the college. Jack Wellenhofer, Josh Romero '20, Nick Eubanks '21, Brandon Crawford '20, John Burton III '23, Connor Sampson, Miles Hayes, Brandon Unangst, and Jaden O'Leary '22 round out a team of coaches who provide each player with the support and leadership necessary for success in the classroom and on the field. Coach Khayat utilizes this multi-level leadership to establish continuous learning as a cornerstone of the culture and part of the DNA of the program.


Preseason includes learning the foundation of the BC Football Program, as well as the importance of living and learning in your community.

We all have different programming, styles, and experiences; we have to be able to work with every single coach and player to build our culture and expectations. We have better performance in the classroom and on the field, learning different ways to apply strategies to get results.
