

Professional Licensure Disclosures

Brevard College does not have any distance education programs that lead to professional licensure. Currently, the only on-campus education programs that lead to professional licensure are Education, Early Childhood Education, and Elementary Education, which prepare students for professional teacher licensure in one of several areas.

In order to meet U.S. Department of Education requirements for disclosure, all higher education institutions are required to disclose to students whether or not their curriculum meets the state educational requirements for licensure or certification in the state in which they plan to practice.

Brevard College's teaching education programs meet the state educational requirements for licensure or certification and are approved by the North Carolina Department of Public Instruction, making possible licensure reciprocity with 45 other states (listed below), as well as with the District of Columbia and Guam.

The following list contains determinations that Brevard College's curriculum meets state educational requirements for teacher licensure or certification within a given state or US territory, vis-à-vis licensure reciprocity:

- Alabama, Arizona, Arkansas, California, Colorado, Connecticut, Delaware, District of Columbia, Florida, Georgia, Hawaii, Idaho, Illinois, Indiana, Kansas, Louisiana, Maine, Maryland, Massachusetts, Michigan, Mississippi, Missouri, Montana, Nebraska, Nevada, New Hampshire, New Jersey, New Mexico, New York, North Dakota, Ohio, Oklahoma, Oregon, Pennsylvania, Rhode Island, South Carolina, South Dakota, Tennessee, Texas, Utah, Vermont, Virginia, Washington, West Virginia, Wisconsin, Wyoming
- Brevard College's teaching education program does not meet the state educational requirements for licensure in Alaska, Iowa, Kentucky, Minnesota, and the following territories: American Samoa, Guam, Puerto Rico, the U.S. Virgin Islands, and Northern Mariana Islands.

The College recommends that students consult with their Program Coordinator or the appropriate licensing agency or board in their state prior to beginning their course of study.
