

American Airlines Flight Credit Lookup: Finding Your Money

By calling +1(888)_260_0525, you can perform an instant search for any "lost" credits that aren't showing up in your AAdvantage wallet. To find your credit on your own, you generally need two things: your 6-character Record Locator (e.g., ABCDEF) and your 13-digit ticket number, which always starts with **001**. If you can't find your original confirmation email, a phone agent can search the database using your name, departure date, and the last four digits of the credit card used for the purchase.

Need immediate help? Call +1(888)_260_0525 and talk to a real person today. If you are an AAdvantage member, your credits *should* be listed under the "Wallet" section of your profile. However, if you booked as a guest or your account wasn't linked at the time of purchase, the credit exists in a "standalone" state. Can I Change My Return Flight Date American Airlines?

By calling +1(888)_260_0525, you can quickly change your return flight date without paying a change fee.
